**QUALIFICATIONS TO BECOME ELIGIBLE FOR TOP TEACHER PURSE**

Teacher must have at least 50 pro/am entries to qualify for any top teacher prize money.

**TOP TEACHER PRIZE MONEY**

**PLACEMENT POINTS TO TEACHERS FOR EACH PRO/AM OR STUDENT/ STUDENT ENTRY:**

If a placement is in an uncontested division, the points will be halved

Pre-Teen, Juniors & Youths: If couples or pro/am pay a reduced fee, they receive 1/2 points

**PRO/AM STUDENT AGE CATEGORIES**

A student may enter in two age categories - their true age division and one lower. See entry forms for age categories.

**DANCE LEVEL CATEGORIES**

Material used should be based on the N.D.C.A. approved syllabus such as DVIDA, ISTD, Arthur Murray, Fred Astaire, etc. and also the Amended Bronze Level American Style.

**CLOSED ONE DANCE DIVISION  
RESTRICTED TO SYLLABUS**

Newcomer-	Less than 50 private lessons
Pre-Bronze-	Beginning Bronze material
Intermediate Bronze-	Intermediate up to Final Bronze
Full Bronze-	Final or completion of Bronze
Pre-Silver-	Beginning Silver material
Intermediate Silver-	Intermediate up to Final Silver
Full Silver-	Final or completion of Silver
Intermediate Gold-	Intermediate up to Final Gold
Full Gold-	Final or completion of Gold

Students may dance in 2 age divisions, their true age plus one age lower. Also, students should enter at their true level of dance and only TWO higher in any one style of dance.

(Example: A Newcomer American-style student may also dance in American style Pre-Bronze & Intermediate Bronze. Students may enter in completely different dance levels in the American Style between Smooth and Rhythm and in the International Style between Standard and Latin.

**OPEN ONE DANCE DIVISION  
NOT RESTRICTED TO SYLLABUS**

Open Bronze
Open Silver
Open Gold
Advanced

No teacher will be permitted to compete with one of his/her students against another of his/her students. It is not possible to compete in the same heat with two people!

In any category with three entries or less, the organizer reserves the right to eliminate the age and sex divisions and merge competitors into one category.

# GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

## 1. Scholarships

To qualify for all scholarship events, a student must enter in a minimum of 4 pro/am single dances per scholarship event entered. All scholarships are unisex competitions for adults. Closed scholarships are restricted to Bronze & Silver students. Please remember that the closed scholarships are restricted to closed syllabus figures (Bronze restricted to Bronze Syllabus and Silver restricted to Bronze & Silver Syllabus). Open scholarships are open to all students at any level and are not restricted to any figures. In any scholarship events with fewer than three entries, the organizer reserves the right to eliminate the age and sex divisions and merge competitors into one division.

## 2. Solo Exhibitions

No Solo Exhibition is to exceed two minutes and forty-five seconds (2:45). Music must be on individual cassettes, CD or mini tape. There are no restrictions in this category. Critique/Score sheets will be given on Solo Exhibitions only.

## 3. Dress Code

Evening wear is suggested for Newcomers. Beginning and above levels are open for ball gowns, Latin dresses or matching costumes, but are not mandatory.

## 4. Restricted Categories/Closed Division Freestyle

A panel of invigilators may be used for all restricted categories/closed divisions. The categories will be strictly supervised and competitors committing infractions may be disqualified.

## 5. Registration

All competing Professionals and Amateurs must be currently registered with the N.D.C.A. Registration forms will be available at the competition or may be Requested by mail to the N.D.C.A or go to [www.ndca.org](http://www.ndca.org): Eleanor Wiblin, PO BOX 22018, Provo, Utah 84602, 801-422-8124

6. All persons attending this event, whether as spectators, officials, competitors or guests of the Organizers shall be bound by the N.D.C.A. rules and, by Participating in this competition, automatically become obliged to adhere to those rules.

7. The organizers of this competition and the N.D.C.A. are not responsible for the loss or theft of articles left in the changing rooms, ballroom(s) or hotel rooms. The Organizer(s) and the N.D.C.A. will not be held liable for injuries sustained by persons attending this event, whether as spectators, officials, competitors or guests of the Organizer(s). Everyone attending does so at his/her own risk.

8. Because of N.D.C.A. rules, no video taping or filming will be allowed. However, a professional video production company will be on hand to video your dancing. Tapes will be made available for purchase.

<p>The deadline for a refund on a cancellation is 30 days prior to the date the competition commences. Refunds will be made by mail, <b>30</b> days following the completion of the competition. If the Organizer is notified of Cancellations after the deadline, credit toward the following year will be considered in cases of <b>emergency only</b> and must accompany a Doctor's Certificate. All divisions are unisex and levels are merged bronze through gold (not restricted to syllabus figures).</li> <li>2) You have to enter the same age in all events through out the year and you can only enter in one age.</li> <li>3) The student can only represent one age and one style in November 2010.</li> <li>4) The teacher can be represented more than once.</li> <li>5) Points will be based on accumulation of callbacks and placements earned through out the 2010 series events starting with the 2009 O.S.B. and team representation will be decided at the conclusion of the last series event prior to the 2010 O.S.B.</li> </ol>

## Amateur Competitions at NDCA Events

A AGE CATEGORY CLASSIFICATIONS The following definitions shall determine competitive age categories:	B DRESS AND/OR COSTUMING
<p><b>1. Pre-Teen</b> Competitors who are 12 years old and younger. "Pre-Teen" competitors may dance up one age classification to the "Junior" category.</p> <p><i>a.</i> A Pre-Teen competitor may not dance up to the "Youth" category unless they request permission in writing from the NDCA Ballroom Department and in turn receive written approval (example - a "Pre-Teen" girl wishing to compete with a "Youth" age boy).</p> <p><i>b.</i> Under no circumstance will a "Pre-Teen" competitor be allowed to compete in the "Adult" age category.</p> <p><b>2. Junior</b> Competitors who are 13, 14, or 15 years old. "Junior" competitors may dance up one age classification to the "Youth" category.</p> <p><i>a.</i> A "Junior" competitor may not apply for permission to dance up to the "Adult" category until they are 15 years old, at which time they would need to follow the same procedure as outlined in rule 1.a. above.</p> <p><b>3. Youth</b> Competitors who are 16, 17, or 18 years old. Nineteen (19) year olds may also dance as youths until they have graduated from high school. "Youth" competitors may concurrently dance up one age classification into the "Adult" category.</p>	<p><b>1. 	<p><b>C SYLLABUS</b> Couples competing in the "Pre-Teen" category must dance restricted Syllabi as noted below. Couples competing in the "Junior", "Youth" and "Adult" categories are not restricted in syllabi unless competing in a "Syllabus" event, or otherwise stipulated by the organizer</p> <p><b>1. Pre-Teen</b> Couples competing in this age category may only dance Bronze, Silver, and Gold figures that conform to the N.D.C.A. LIST OF ALLOWABLE FIGURES AND ELEMENTS FOR COMPETITIONS. (for a complete list of allowable figures, visit <a href="http://www.emeraldball.com">www.emeraldball.com</a>). In the absence of this list couples may then only dance Bronze, Silver and Gold syllabi of member organizations of the N.D.C.A.</p>
